The annual WellChild Awards culminates in one of the most high-profile events in the charity calendar. It achieves outstanding audience reach, including national and regional media coverage throughout the year, thanks to an engaging and extensive marketing campaign.

Established in 2005, the Awards celebrate the remarkable and inspirational bravery of children and young people from across the UK who have coped, against the odds, with a serious illness or disability. The Awards also highlight the individuals, especially the carers and health professionals who make a real difference to the lives of seriously ill children and their families.

Often a once in a lifetime opportunity for the winners and their families to attend the exclusive invitation only event, regularly attended by WellChild Patron, The Duke of Sussex, who in 2019 was accompanied by The Duchess of Sussex and many other celebrity supporters.

COVID-19 meant the Awards had to be cancelled in 2020, but we were delighted to see a smaller scale version of the ceremony return in 2021, with the Duke of Sussex meeting all the winners to discuss and shine a light on the challenges they have faced during the pandemic, whilst bringing some much-needed hope and positivity to their lives.

We are delighted to return to a larger scale event this year, and The WellChild Awards Ceremony will be held in London in the Autumn 2022, with the date and venue to be confirmed.
